## UMDVS Lecture Series – "The Emergence, Development, and Contemporary Direction of the New Historiography Movement in China" Was Successfully Held

On June 5, the IAS hosted a UM distinguished guest lecture by Professor Nianqun Yang from the Institute of Qing History, Renmin University of China, and a Changjiang Distinguished Professor. Moderated by Professor Di Wang, IAS Associate Director and Chair Professor of History at FAH, the lecture examined the historical and theoretical evolution of the "New Historiography" movement. Topics included the literary nature of history, its theoretical influences, political role, global history, modernity vs. nationalism, historiographical schools, and grand narratives. Professor Yang highlighted the importance of spatial perspectives, historiographical independence, middle-range theories, and native narratives.

### UMDVS Series – Discussion with Professor Nianqun Yang Was Successfully Held

On June 13, the IAS successfully hosted a discussion as part of the UM Distinguished Visiting Scholars Series. Professor Yang focused on the application of "middlerange theory" in Chinese historiography, highlighting the challenge of adapting Western theories to native contexts. He presented the middle-range theory as a dynamic framework bridging macro and micro perspectives, avoiding the oversimplification of materialist historiography and the fragmentation of regional social history.



Guest Lecture "Regenerative Medicine for Sale: The Governance of Private DTC RM Therapies" Was Successfully Held

The lecture focused on developing a multi-tiered legal intervention framework that includes federal-level regulation of healthcare products and competition law, provincial consumer protection mechanisms, determinations of professional liability for medical practitioners, and medical ethical standards. The discussion was highly engaging, with participants delving deeply into the possibilities of governance, providing valuable insights and recommendations for improving the regulatory framework.
