Arts and Academic Lecture Series No.22 - "Doing Art, Doing What?" was Successfully Concluded

When presenting his own works, Professor Bing Xu introduced several significant projects, including Gravitational Arena, Book from the Sky, Phoenix, and Dragonfly Eyes, and elaborated on the design concepts behind them. Through these works, he extended the discussion to the relationship between art and civilization, covering a wide range of issues from the representation of ancient civilizations to contemporary topics such as environmental sustainability and artificial intelligence. The lecture attracted nearly 300 participants on site and close to 4,500 viewers online.

Professor Frederick Lau delivered a lecture on music in academic Chinese studies. He discussed the

evolution of songs across historical periods, music's role in expressing collective memory, national sentiment, and soft power, and its potential to enrich interdisciplinary studies of Chinese culture. Attended by over sixty faculty and students, the lecture highlighted music's narrative and cultural importance, fostering interdisciplinary dialogue and reflecting IAS's commitment to broadening analytical approaches in Chinese studies. Connected Future," highlighted Prof. Lau's emphasis on music's ability to transcend linguistic and cultural boundaries, fostering empathy, negotiation, and dialogue. She further emphasized that music is not just artistic expression but a metaphor for interdisciplinary collaboration, where diverse voices unite to create something greater than their individual contributions.
